

How to use Henrietta Street by bicycle

Henrietta Street is a set of one-way streets between Birrell Street and Bronte Road which meet at Victoria Street, where vehicles can exit towards Charing Cross.

Henrietta Street is also a two-way bicycle route.

Contra-bike lanes are painted with green paint, on one side only of each street. If you are riding a bicycle in the opposite direction to the one-way travel, you should use the contra-flow lane as shown by the direction of travel below. Vehicles must not drive in the contra-flow bike lane.

If you are riding a bike in the same direction as the traffic, you should use the travel lane as marked below.

When connecting between the two parts of Henrietta Street take care and give way to pedestrians crossing the road and when crossing the path of vehicles turning into Victoria Street. Use the triangular island as a refuge where necessary.



Accessing Henrietta Street from Victoria Street

If you are riding to Henrietta Street from Charing Cross please do not ride to the end of Victoria Street at Henrietta Street as there is no safe way to manoeuvre through the intersection coming from this direction. This is a No Through Road for motor vehicles and bikes.

When riding down Victoria Street you have two options to reach Henrietta Street as follows:

1.Turn right off Victoria Street to Prospect Street using the short contra-flow bike lane to Prospect Lane which then connects to Henrietta Street South. From this point you can either continue south using the contra-flow lane or turn north onto the travel lane. Watch for cross traffic when exiting the lane.





2. Turn left off Victoria Street into Wiley Street. Use Wiley Street and Salisbury Street to access Henrietta Street not far from Birrell Street.



This route is more suitable if travelling north towards Birrell Street. Wiley and Salisbury Streets are relatively quiet, except at school drop-off and pick-up times, but there are no bicycle lane or on-road logos.

Accessing Victoria Street from Henrietta Street

If accessing Victoria St westbound from Henrietta St then follow the main travel lane through the intersection and then use the uphill bicycle shoulder lane that begins at the bottom of Victoria St.
