Angophora hispida Dwarf Apple

Description

An attractive native large shrub to small tree with profuse flowers in summer

Size

Small sized native tree. Upright to broad-domed in shape but variable

Height: 4 to 6 metres

Width: 3 to 5 metres

Pruning: some early shaping required to keep the tree single trunked and upright

Features

- Can have a twisted informal shape suitable for informal native gardens
- Very attractive reddish/purple new growth
- Profusion of large white flowers in late summer.

Uses

- Screening
- Feature tree
- Great food source for native wildlife
- Street tree for drier conditions

Preferred conditions

Prefers full sun in sandy well drained soils. Moderately coastal tolerant but prefers some protection from adjacent plants
