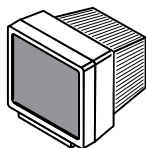


Special waste recycling

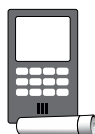
Fridge Buy Back

Container Recycling

- ✓ Plastic bottles and jars
- ✓ Plastic takeaway containers
- ✓ Glass bottles and jars
- ✓ Aluminium and steel cans
- ✓ Aerosol cans
- ✓ Clean aluminium foil
- ✓ Clean foil trays



Paper & Cardboard Recycling

- ✓ Cardboard
- ✓ Paper
- ✓ Poppers (straws removed)
- ✓ Milk/juice cartons
- ✓ Telephone books
- ✓ Newspapers/magazines (no plastic wrapping)
- ✓ Pizza boxes
- ✓ Egg cartons



Garden Waste Recycling

- ✓ Grass cuttings
- ✓ Weeds
- ✓ Prunings
- ✓ Flower cuttings
- ✓ Branches up to 100mm diameter
- ✓ Christmas trees if cut up

Plastic bags can jam and shut down machinery at the recycling facility, so always recycle them at participating supermarkets.



Although Styrofoam has a recycling symbol, it can't be processed at our recycling facility.

There's no need to remove staples or plastic windows from envelopes before recycling.



Tissues and paper towels have non-recyclable fibers, but they can be composted.
