### Container Recycling

- ✓ Plastic bottles and jars
- Plastic takeaway containers
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminium and steel cans
- ✓ Aerosol cans
- Clean aluminium foil
- ✓ Clean foil trays
- Plastic bags and wrap
- Drinking glasses, window glass or mirrors
- × Polystyrene
- Light globes
- Crockery
- Syringes

#### **Recycle Right**

- - Plastic bags can jam and shut down machinery at the recycling facility, so always recycle them at participating supermarkets.



Although Styrofoam has a recycling symbol, it can't be processed at our recycling facility.

### **Recycle Right**

There's no need to remove staples or plastic windows from envelopes before recycling.

Paper & Cardboard Recycling

- Tissues and paper towels have non-recyclable fibers, but they can be composted.
- The biggest contaminant in a recent recycling audit in the area was the plastic wrap around the Wentworth Courier.
